












# A MESSAGE FROM OUR COUNCILLOR MORE FROM MAURICE



#### PROPERTY CHANGES IN AND AROUND BGCC

The following information was shared with the homeowners who attended their Condo's AGM earlier this year. I am featuring the information in this article because many residents were unable to attend those meetings.

Last year I was advised by Schickedanz Brothers that they had completed the final build-out of the Ballantrae Golf Club project. Yes, they will still own the golf course. No, it has not been sold. No, it is not for sale. No, they are not going to build any more homes within BGCC. The project has simply come to an end after 20 years of building.

There are, however, a few issues they asked the town staff and me to address. Most of these can be classified as minor changes made to the original by-law enacted to officially allow the building of our BGCC project. These changes have now been signed into law.

However, one important outstanding matter deals with the bush lot or parcel of land between the eighth fairway of the golf course and the Ninth Line. Note the attached outline of this parcel of land.



As is most of the land in our area, this parcel of 11.67 hectares or approximately 29 acres is strictly controlled and governed by the province's Oak Ridges Moraine legislation (ORMA).

With this parcel of land Schickedanz had two viable options. One, they could hold or sell to a developer who would then wait out any change that may happen

to the ORMA and then perhaps build a development. Their second option was to invoke a section under the ORMA that allows for the severance of lands to facilitate conveyance to a public body for natural heritage conservation. Note: in the legislation the severance of any parcel of land must be made to a public body; it could not be made to a private holding such as our condo associations. Discussions between Schickedanz, myself and town staff over the last many months have led to their decision to sever the outlined acreage and donate it as heritage lands. Basically the property title for these 29 acres would be transferred to the Stouffville Park Trust. The best part of this transfer is that the land would then never be developed. It would forever remain as parkland.

In order to continue through this process, I brought before a June council meeting a motion providing staff the authority to finalize this matter with Schickedanz Bros. In effect, it is now before staff with the objective of having this property designated as heritage parkland by the end of 2019. As part of the council motion, funds were allocated so that town staff would have the resources to clean and remark the trails in this great piece of property.

#### **CORNER PLAZA**

In an article on this page last year I indicated the Tim Horton's in the new Ballantrae Gates plaza could possibly be opened before the snow-birds returned home in the spring. Unfortunately, many issues have bogged down this project. Don't listen to all the rumours, Tim's IS coming. The "Opening Soon" sign has been posted!

#### **EMERGENCY SERVICES IN BALLANTRAE AREA**

I have always been a proponent of providing increased full-services from the EMS station immediately outside our front gates. To this end I supported adding funds to cover the cost of a permanent full-time crew (24/7) in the current budget. Effective early this year, 24/7 service became a reality. With the addition of full-time crews a significant capital expenditure will ultimately be required. I also support this expenditure and act as one of the council representatives on the committee reviewing this matter. More information on this process should be available by year end.



# **Donate your**Summer Games T-shirts!

After the games, what will you do with those condo-coloured T-shirts? Unless yours fits better than most, you might consider washing and delivering it to our Recreation Centre. For the past several games, Ray and Pat Stadnick have arranged to donate the T-shirts to many small charities throughout the world.

In 2017, 200 T-shirts were delivered to a charity for the homeless at Dundas and Parliament Streets in Toronto. The Stadnick's church, Cedarview Community Church in Newmarket, takes food and clothing monthly to that area. Another 75 T-shirts went to Guatemala, 75 to Mishkeegoganang First Nation in northern Ontario (a friend had been a pastor there), and 60 to the Ukraine. In total, 410 T-shirts were taken to those places by personal contacts who packed them in their own luggage. Shipping these articles would otherwise be expensive. In the past they have received photos of the recipients.

This year contacts through the church have said they can use as many as collected. Two friends, missionaries for the Pentecostal Assemblies of Canada, go to Liberia two to three times a year and would take some. Others would go through personal contacts to Heart for Africa in Swaziland, a charity for which Ray served on the Board.

# Feeding the Athletes

While many of us snowbirds were packing up to return to the great white north, Lowell and Bonnie Dennis were already planning the food for the Summer Games.

Can you imagine planning, shopping, prepping, cooking and serving 3,500 plus meals over the course of nine days? It makes my head spin just thinking about it, but that's precisely what they do. While I was experiencing the vapours listening to what went into feeding such a large hungry crowd, Lowell was as cool as a cucumber.


"Planning is key," says Lowell. Their goal is to serve quality food without line-ups and to never run out of food. The challenge is that they never know the exact number of diners until it's time to feed everyone. Each meal is planned in advance and the quantities are staggering. For the opening day there are 20 pizzas, 300 hot dogs, 300 burgers, 50 veggie burgers, a few hundred sandwiches and hundreds of ice cream treats. For chicken night, there are over 300 pieces of chicken—that's 150 pounds. On steak night there are 300 steaks and an equal amount of baked potatoes, all cooked on two large barbecues. Ninety pizzas will round out pizza

night and 360 pounds of ribs for rib fest. Plus, there are 35 lasagna trays, 100 pounds of chicken to be made into a pasta dish, 350 burgers for burger night along with 90 pounds of chicken wings and 50 pounds of meatballs. Then, to close off this amazing event, copious amounts of roast beef and pulled pork are served. There is a different salad with every meal, made fresh daily.


Lowell and Bonnie do all the price negotiating, shopping and most of the prep themselves, although they are assisted by volunteer ticket sellers, bartenders, food pick-up, servers, kitchen help and clean-up help.

There is also the bar that needs to be stocked and replenished for all the thirsty athletes after their strenuous workouts.

You might think all of this is being done in a massive, professional kitchen, but most of it is done in the Recreation Centre in the tiny kitchen. I asked Lowell and Bonnie how they manage to keep their cool with this much pressure. Both just smiled; they seem to delight in the pleasure their food brings to everyone who participates.

# The **Pursuit** of Trivia

What is a Canadian classic success story and a great trivia question? Which Canadian game has been the biggest phenomenon in board game history and was named to the Games Hall of Fame in 1993? The correct answer: Trivial Pursuit!

Trivial Pursuit was created by Chris Haney, a high school dropout photo editor

for *The Montreal Gazette* and Scott Abbott, the sports editor for *The Canadian Press* who met covering the 1976 Summer Olympics in Montreal. The story goes that on December 15, 1979, after a few beers, Chris and Scott realized that many letters were missing from their Scrabble game, so they decided to create their own game. Its foundation was grounded on general knowledge questions encompassing a wide variety of subjects. The original Trivial Pursuit game had 6,000 questions based on a universe of facts.

Chris and Scott formed the Horn Abbot Company but soon recognized that they needed help from Chris' big brother, John and lawyer friend, Ed Werner. It took another two years to find investors to move the project forward. Financing Trivial Pursuit involved convincing and acquiring 32 shareholders to invest \$1,000 each. Chris and Scott would each receive 22% of the company, Ed and John would each receive 18%. Eighteen year-old Michael Wurstlin agreed to create the final artwork for Trivial Pursuit in exchange for five shares in the company. Chieftain Products Ltd. became the Canadian distributor of the game. And the rest is history!

Trivial Pursuit was shown at the American Toy Fair in NYC in February, 1982 and to their disappointment only a few hundred games were ordered. A year later, 2.3 million games were sold in Canada and a million in the United States.

Despite the slow start to the game's popularity, sales peaked in 1984 when 20 million games had been sold. An estimated one in five households had a Trivial Pursuit board game with sales reaching \$800 million. The game was a huge hit particularly with nostalgic baby boomers.

Several legal actions were taken against the propriety and originality of the game. The first was by the author of a trivia encyclopedia, who filed a \$300 million lawsuit, claiming that questions in his book were copied. The court ruled that trivia facts were not protected by copyright. The decision was appealed and the court declined again. The second lawsuit was from a friend of Chris Haney who claimed he and a colleague picked up Chris while hitch hiking and told him about the idea. Proof of these claims was never verified and the courts eventually ruled against the challenge.

By December 1993, Trivial Pursuit was sold in 33 countries with versions in 19 languages.

Hasbro bought the intellectual rights to Trivial Pursuit for \$80 million in 2008. Over the years, numerous editions of Trivial Pursuit have been produced specializing in a variety of topics: Sports Edition, Silver Screen Edition, Walt Disney Family Edition and even a Star Wars Edition.

Chris Haney invested his profits into two outstanding golf courses - Devil's Pulpit and Devil's Paintbrush. Both have spectacular scenery on the Niagara Escarpment and are rated in the Top 100 Golf Courses in Canada. Chris "lived hard" and died in 2010 at the age of 59.

Scott Abbott, who was known as the "games aficionado," now owns the North Bay Battalion hockey team of the Ontario Hockey League and was inducted into the Brampton Sports Hall of Fame for his work in building the North Bay hockey club. Scott also owns a horse racing stable with one of his horses once placing in the Queen's Plate.

Ed Werner presently lives in Niagara-on-the-Lake on his vineyard and enjoys sailboat racing and winemaking with his sons.

John Haney, Chris' brother, wrote most of the questions on science and nature. His favourite game was the Baby Boomers edition and the Original edition, of which only 1200 games were made.

John and Ed had been hockey teammates at Colgate University, a private liberal arts college in Upstate, New York

Winning Trivial Pursuit is determined by a player's ability to answer general knowledge and even quirky questions. For example, "What's the largest diamond in the world?" The correct answer – a baseball diamond!

Trivial Pursuit started, revolved and ended in the pursuit of happiness. Obviously, Chris, Scott, Ed and John were entrepreneurs who pursued a whimsical dream and realized major trivialities!



I am sure the professional scouts were out to the Ballantrae Summer Games and you are ready to sign that big contract, but you need a Sports Agent. Look no further ... we have one of the best, living here in our community!

Surrounded by an impressive display of signed memorabilia, awards and photos, I interviewed Gil Scott, president of Gil Scott Sports Management.

# GROWING UP IN TORONTO, DID YOU EVER IMAGINE BECOMING A SPORTS AGENT MAKING MULTI-MILLION DOLLAR DEALS?

No, but I did have a dream to be a sportscaster. As a youngster, my life was influenced by my father, Dr. Jack Scott, and his involvement with the Baptist church. He had one of the largest ministries in the 50s and 60s and was


President of Youth for Christ in Canada started by Charles Templeton. My dad had his own radio program and church service on Hamilton TV. He was a good friend of Billy Graham who

came to speak at his church. There is a picture of me with Dr. Graham when I was five years old. A church in Detroit recruited Dad and we moved there when I was 12.

# AS A YOUNG BOY, THIS WOULD BE A BIG CHANGE FROM LIFE IN TORONTO. WHERE DID THIS PATH LEAD?

I graduated from Michigan State University with a Bachelors degree in Radio and Television Arts. I returned to Toronto and met with Bill Stephenson, sports director for CFRB radio station with hopes of landing a sportscaster job. I was advised that I should start in a small town and work my way up. Not wanting to leave Toronto, I began a career selling life insurance.

#### HOW DID SELLING LIFE INSURANCE TRANSITION INTO A CAREER AS A HIGH-PROFILE SPORTS AGENT?

It was my involvement with Athletes in Action, a faith-based organization, that introduced me to the field of sports agency. In 1976, AIA had a Pro Week in the Toronto area where I volunteered to drive NFL and CFL athletes around to different schools to talk to high school kids. It was there I met Chuck Ealey\* and he introduced me to a few other players. I started giving seminars on financial planning and one day Nick Bastaja asked if I would negotiate his new contract with the Argos. I said sure. I got him a good deal and it all built from there. My big break came when I met Dieter Brock through Nick. Dieter asked me to explain tax shelters and such. When he was in Toronto to accept his first Schenley award in 1980, he phoned me and asked if I'd represent him. I did, and the rest is history.

# HOW DID YOUR EXPERIENCE IN INSURANCE SALES PREPARE YOU FOR THESE HIGH-POWERED NEGOTIATIONS?

Salesmanship is a big part of the job. You have to sell the player to get him, you've got to sell the club on signing him and then you've got to sell the right deal to the club.

#### A SPORTS AGENT'S JOB HAS BEEN DESCRIBED AS PART BABYSITTER, MARRIAGE COUNSELLOR AND SPOKESMAN, BUT ABOVE ALL SALESMAN. HOW DO YOU BALANCE ALL THESE RESPONSIBILITIES?

It is like solving a big puzzle. I find it very exciting. But in the end, the great relationships are what you remember the most.

# YOU HAVE NEGOTIATED OVER 300 CONTRACTS. WHAT CHANGES IN THE PROFESSION HAVE YOU SEEN OVER THE YEARS?

It wasn't until 1984 that agents had to be certified. Now, in the NFL, you have to have a Masters degree to apply. As of June 2018 you must complete an annual exam and if you fail, you are de-certified. There is an annual fee to pay and liability insurance is a must. Today there are over 869 agents to represent 1500 players in the NFL. A young hockey player will be approached by many agents before he will sign. The loyalty was great in the early days. Now, not so much.

# THERE MUST BE A CONFLICT WHEN THERE IS A GAME FEATURING TWO OR MORE OF YOUR CLIENTS ON OPPOSING TEAMS. IS IT DIFFICULT TO STAY IMPARTIAL?

I'm often conflicted before a game but I always want both players to play well. I root for my players, not the team. I know at the end of the night I'll have to visit the victory party and the not-so victory party. I can make a case for wanting both sides to win, but in the end, I don't want either side to lose.


