A MESSAGE FROM OUR COUNCILLOR MORE FROM MAURICE

Our Drinking Water

Water is an essential part of our everyday lives yet we often take it for granted. We turn on the shower and the water comes out clear. We fill a coffee pot and enjoy a hot brew. However, there is a lot of work behind the scenes that goes into providing that crystal clear water we use every day.

The Province of Ontario sets the standards and is responsible for enforcement, but other parties play a bigger and more important role.

The water for Ballantrae Golf & Country Club and surrounding area comes from one of the deepest aquifers in Canada. York Region equipment draws the water and sends it to their tower on Ninth Line, south of Musselman's Lake. Stouffville is responsible for the distribution and quality as well as recovering the cost, based on consumption, from individual homes and businesses.

On at least a quarterly basis, town staff visit BGCC to flush the system within our community. This is important on cul-de-sacs and Legendary Trail where underground piping comes to a dead-end. During this process, staff complete micro-biological and chlorine sampling to ensure that they are meeting provincial quality standards.

The underground distribution system is complex and costly to the town. In 2022 a capital infrastructure fee was allocated to our water bills. This fee covers a required reserve for infrastructure capital for the longer term.

In a previous column I outlined the advantages of a program called WaterWatch. This system is available to all who have installed current smart water meters.

Through the new WaterWatch portal you can:

- Set and receive leak alerts
- Identify usage and monitor efficiencies
- View and compare historical usage data
- Access account information from anywhere

This is just another tool to save money and to contribute to the conservation of this precious commodity that we often take for granted.

Ballantrae Fire Station

Yes, it is moving, but it is not moving to the cleared lands at the corner of Aurora Road and Highway 48.

The clearing of the buildings on those lands was more about caution and safety than for any other reason. The owner and I had many discussions about my concerns that the buildings were becoming a fire hazard to the community. The owner will apply for building permits for the site in the future but there is no current request. A big challenge for any development will be water and sewage disposal considerations.

The proposed site for the fire station is 4902 Aurora Road. You may be aware that this was the location of the family who built and stored Muskoka-style tables and chairs in their yard. The town recently purchased this property. Design concepts for a new fire station are underway.

Home Safety Lock Box

In BGCC, neighbours have risen to the challenge of looking out for one another. This is important particularly if you are a resident living alone.

A challenge sometimes faced by first responders when called is that there is no response at the door. They must then consider a forced entry which could involve breaking a sidelight and unlocking the door.

Emergency services staff now have a simple alternative solution to a forced entry if the resident is non-responsive. They have for purchase, a sturdy and secure lock box which can be installed outside the door. The lock box can contain a key to the main door and can be opened only by the responding official.

Many have been installed and they can still be purchased by contacting Jeff Bignell, of our fire service at 905-640-9595, ext. 6229.

The Canada Goose

This autumn, as we hear the familiar honking of Canada Geese flying overhead in their distinctive V formation, we recognize a nuisance and a pure Canadiana symbol.

There are two species of geese – the Canada Goose and the Cackling Goose – they look identical but the Cackling Goose is smaller with a stubby bill. The Canada Goose (*branta canadensis*) is part of our national identity and is found in every Canadian province and territory. There are more than five million Canada Geese in North America!

The distinctive black head and neck and white chin strap is familiar to all of us. The male Canada Goose weighs between 2.6 and 6.5 kg and measures 75-110 cm in length with a wingspan of 127 to 185 cm. A Canada Goose's lifespan is from 10 to 24 years. They eat grains, seeds, berries, aquatic plants and insects, and mate for life, seeking partners of similar size. They will nest in the same region (fields, underbrush and large grassy areas) just as their parents did and will use the same nest every year.

Goose chicks or goslings learn to swim, walk and find their own food within days of being born. They travel in broods under the watchful and very protective eye of their parents. Adult Canada Geese will hiss, spit, attack and chase you down if you approach their young, so beware!

A single Canada Goose has between 20,000 and 25,000 feathers. The stubby down feathers help insulate the bird from cold water and freezing temperatures. In late summer, flight feathers are shed and over the next few weeks new feathers grow. During this time of regrowth the geese are unable to fly and will retreat into water if they are threatened by any of their predators (coyotes, foxes, raccoons and gulls). A single Canada Goose can "let go" of droppings every 12 minutes or 100 times per day!

The V-pattern of flight has a purpose – it helps the geese maintain their energy and improves communication. Each bird flies above the bird in front of them to reduce wind resistance which enables them to see the other birds for overall coordination. When the lead bird tires, it moves to the back of the flock for a rest. Speeds of 100 kilometres per hour have been recorded and when conditions are right, Canada Geese can travel up to 1,000 kilometres per day.

So when you hear that familiar honking, you will know that a flock of 30 to 100 birds are talking to each other and deciding where their next pit stop will be; hopefully not at Ballantrae golf course!

You may remember Grey Brett from his profile in the winter 2021 issue. The Ballantrae resident was diagnosed with a rare auto-immune disease called primary sclerosing cholangitis (PSC) in 2005. It is an incurable, progressive disease that results in liver failure. Fortunate to receive and survive a liver transplant in 2015, Grey promised himself to live life to the fullest and follow his dreams. Wanting to be an example for his young daughter and wanting to get back to his athletic endeavours as a competitive swimmer and kick boxer, his goal was to compete in the Canadian Transplant Games held in Toronto in 2016. After a strenuous recovery path, he not only reached his goal of participating, he also won five gold medals in the swimming events. But in his words, the biggest reward was meeting fellow competitors who introduced him to the World Transplant Games. The 2017 Games in Malaga, Spain and the 2019 Games in Newcastle, England awarded him with several world records and more gold medals for Canada.

His amazing accomplishments in the pool don't reflect his amazing accomplishments living with PSC. A transplant is not a cure and the disease brings constant complications and ongoing struggles. Grey thought his days of competitive swimming were over when the World Games took a four year hiatus due to COVID-19. However, he set his sights on the World Games in Perth, Australia this past April. Through his determination and devotion to healthy eating and exercising and a positive mental attitude, he raced in five aquatic events over two days. Reaching his own personal best in each race, he set five world records and won gold in each event!



While standing proud at the closing ceremonies, Grey was surprised and honoured to be awarded the Most Outstanding Male Athlete of the games. "After everything I've been through in life, in and out of hospitals, this was validation for it all."

Since the fall of 2022, he has been swimming with the Aurora Master Ducks four to five times a week. He will be featured as the keynote speaker at the 2023 Sports Aurora Breakfast of Champions this October. His charity work includes participating in a 30 km relay swim across Lake Muskoka to raise funds so that liver transplant children will be able to attend a one week summer camp.

What's next? The 2025 Transplant Games in Dresden, Germany are a possibility, but also continuing his work with the Move For Life Foundation that he and two colleagues started in 2021 with the intention of raising donor awareness, inspiring transplant recipients and creating a vehicle for fundraising.



They completed this reno by installing a linear fireplace under a large television. Painting the walls a lovely soft grey pulls together the two spaces.


I think you will agree that this renovation is a great success that provides the Bannons with lots more work and storage space, and a clean uncluttered contemporary design.

BSG Chairman, Phil Bannon, said it best: "Can you think of a better way to go out, than to have the Pacemakers at full volume!" It rocked!




